Strange Minhagim: Oxen in the Cemetery

Oxen in the cemetery is a Jewish "minhag"? You must be kidding, Henry, aren't you? Turns out he is not. This minhag has its roots in a halacha in the Torah that states that a bechor behaima, a first born of an animal, must be given to a kohain who can eat it only betahara. No problem so far. But what happens today when every kohain is more than likely tamei and there is no bais hamikdash. You can't do anything with the animal until it develops a permanent blemish, a mum kavua. So the people in many countries during the middle ages came up with an interesting idea. They gave their first born oxen to the caretaker of the local Jewish cemetery and paid him to take care of the animals. What better place to allow animals to wander freely, earing up the grass (an esrly style lawnmower) until they developed a mum than a cemetery! Thus the oxen in the cemetery. About 1650 in Frankfort am Main a workman erecting a monument in a cemetery was gored by one of the oxen and died because of his injuries. The authorities then sent in the army to shoot the ox which upset the Jewish community. By the second half of the 18th century the practice was abandoned. So what do people do with their firsy born oxen today? A new plan was devised to solve this problem of the bechor beheima and that is...oh, we don't pasken she-ailot here. For the answer to this question you must ask one of the rabbis in town. But you have to admit: this was a strange minhag.
