Sof davar....

by Rabbi Israel Poleyeff, Research by Henry Lerner A not so strange minhag: Kloppin Hoshanos

Everyone does it, yet I suspect few if any really know why they do it. This ritual, as everyone also knows, is performed on Hoshanah Rabbah near the conclusion of the *hoshanos tefilos* and is accompanied by the recitation of the phrase *kol mevasser mevasser veomer* ("a voice brings news, brings news saying...") expressing hope for the speedy coming of the *moshiach*. The *gemara* in Sukkah (44b) mentions that a person came before R. Elazar ben Zadok with *aravos* and performed "*chavit chavit*" with it. Rashi interperets *chavit* as 'waving' (as with the *lulav*), not striking. So where does this *minhag* of striking the ground come from and what is it supposed to connote? Merely to say that it is a *minhag neviim* (as the *gemara* itself does) is not sufficient. What reason would the *neviim* have for instituting this rather odd *minhag*? The earliest known mention of striking the ground with the *arovos* is found in the Zohar which also mentions that exactly five *aravos* are taken for the ceremony. The practice of some people to beat the *aravos* until there are no leaves remaining is folk custom and has no basis in *halacha*. Mention is made in the *Yavetz siddur* that with each *klop* of the *hoshanos* the person states that it should result in the calming of the divine attitude (whatever that means). So what IS the function of this *minhag*? An informal discussion in our *shul* during the weeks following Hoshanah Rabbah elicited some esoteric, some outlandish and some convoluted reasons which satisfied no one. But if you have a plausible reason we'd like to hear it. Talk to Harvey Atlas.
