ISRAELI ESROGIM

Please note that Israeli Esrogim must be treated with special care, because they were grown in a Shmitta year. (This is the case even though the esrog was grown under Otzar Bais Din.) There are 3 options:

- The esrog should be sent back to Israel.
- The esrog should be allowed to dry and wither. When this occurs, the esrog is wrapped in paper or placed in a bag and
- The esrog is eaten. However any portion not consumed (such as peels or pits, or left over parts of the flesh) must be left to dry as in the previous option before being discarded.

Sof davar...

Tannaim and Amoraim: Rav Achai

Quick! Who was the first Talmudic scholar to author a *sefer* of *halacha?* No, it was not the Rambam or the Rosh. The distinction goes to Rav Achai whose *sefer*, called the "Sh'-iltot d'rav Achai Gaon', is quoted extensively primarily in *tosafot*. Rav Achai was a first generation gaon who hailed from Pumbedissa in modern day Iraq. He was in line to become the gaon of the yeshiva in Pumbedissa (a very prestigious position) after the passing of the gaon Rav Shmuel bar Mar. But the Reish Galuta, Rav Shlomo bar Chasdai, chose Rav Naturai Kahana bar Rav Emunah as the gaon. What must have upset Rav Achai even further was that R. Naturai was one of his students! Perhaps out of bitter disappointment Rav Achai left Bavel for Eretz Yisroel never to return. It is his *sefer* Sh'-iltot that has earned Rav Achai lasting fame. The *sefer* follows the *parshiot* of the Torah and is divided into four sections: an introduction, questions of *halacha*, medrashic *droshot*, and a summation. Some suggest that the *sefer* was written primarily for his son. It seems his son was not the most studious of students. Studying the *sefer* each week would keep his son in touch with the *halachic* and *medrashic* world. In the copies of the Sh'-iltot that have survived to this day a number of parts are clearly missing. Missing also is any information about Rav Achai in Eretz Yisroel. After leaving Bavel for the Holy Land we know nothing of his life or activities there other than the fact that he passed away there in either 752 or 762.
