Sof davar (100)... by Rabbi Israel Poleyeff Gedolim of the recent past: R. Moshe Aharon The young men in the small town of Timkowitz often went swimming in a nearby stream during the summer months. One

of them never joined his friends because of his fear of water. This one day, however, he could not resist the temptation and jumped into the stream. Almost instantly the current caught him and began to sweep him downstream. He lost all control and was sure he would drown. At that moment an arm grabbed him around his shoulders and pulled him to safety. His rescuer's name was Kanatopsky, one of his close chaverim. That close call was followed 15 years later, in 1920, by another close call when the Bolsheviks were overrunning most of Russia. The Bolsheviks were arresting all clergymen, Jewish and non-Jewish alike, and sending them off to Siberia. They were rapidly approaching Timkowitz. With not a moment to spare R. Moshe Aharon and his family left their home town forever just one day before the Bolsheviks arrived. R. Moshe fled first to Warsaw eventually boarding a ship for the United States. Three weeks after his arrival R. Moshe Aharon was appointed a rebbi at a yeshiva on the lower East Side. It was the beginning of a career as rosh yeshiva that was to last over 46 years, during which time he earned the reputation as one of the generation's true gadolei hador. He moved up the ranks till he gave one of the top shiurim at Yeshivas Rabbeinu Yitzchak Elchanan. R. Moshe had extremely poor eyesight and for all intents and purposes gave his shiurim by heart. A classic photo of R. Moshe shows him giving a shiur with his gemara upside down. He was the author of several acclaimed sifrei halacha, and earned the enviable reputation of being one of the most beloved rosheiu yeshiva in Yeshiva history. Recognizing R. Moshe Aharon's contributions to Yeshiva and to the Torah world he was awarded an honorary doctorate by Yeshiva in 1962 and years later a room (307 Fursrt Hall) was dedicated in his memory. Thousands attended his levaya in 1966. You know him better as R. Moshe Aharon Poleyeff.
