#### **ELON MOREH**

The medical clinic in Elon Moreh needs our help. It turns out they have a doctor that comes to them

twice a week. At other times the nurse in the clinic has to triage patients. When patients come with chest pain or other heart related symptoms they have to make a decision whether to send them to a hospital over an hour away. At night this becomes particularly dangerous going thru Arab areas. They would like to get an interpretive EKG machine that would help them with evaluating cardiac problems and deciding whether to send the patient urgently by ambulance to the nearest hospital.

The cost of the interpretive EKG machine is about \$3000. It would be great if the members of OT could donate the machine. It would provide additional info in making a life or death decision to determine if there is an emergency worth the risk of transferring the patient at night to the hospital. If we can get 30 families to donate \$100 dollars each we cover the cost. Families donating will be listed on a plaque in the Elon Moreh clinic. Checks can be made out to Cong. Ohr Torah or Amer. #### **Jewish Communities: Berditchev**

Everyone is surely familiar with Reb Levi Yitzchak of Berditchev. He is most widely known for his spirited defense of the Jews before G-d even in the face of their wrongdoing. His most famous defense was when he saw a Jew (according to one version) smoking on Yom Kippur. After ascertaining that the Jew knew full well that it was Yom Kippur and knew as well that you were not permitted to smoke on the holiest day of the year but smoked anyway, R. Levi Yitzchak turned to the heavens and said to G-d, "look how great your people are. Even when they are *mechallel yom tov* they will not lie". R. Levi Yitzchak may have been Berditchev's most famous son but this town in Volhynia, Ukraine, was no tiny *shtetl*. Though the first Jew arrived in 1593 it was not until 1732 that a significant number of Jews had settled there and a charter was issued to a Jewish guild of tailors. By 1847 Jews made up more than 50% of the total population of Berditchjev when there were 40,00 Jews living there. The Jewish currents and movements that swept the Jewish world in the next century and even earlier swept through Berditchev as well. Chassidism took hold in Berditchev in the last quarter of the 18<sup>th</sup> century. Haskala found a home there in the early 19<sup>th</sup> century. Yiddishist philosophy took root in the late 18<sup>th</sup> and early 19<sup>th</sup> centuries to the extent that court procedures were conducted in Yiddish. But the city also suffered the usual slings and arrows of the outside world. In 1919 they were the victims of a pogrom, and in the '40s the Nazis arrived...
