# Vaad HaRabbonim of Raritan Valley Purchasing Chometz After Pesach

One may not eat or derive benefit from chometz which was owned by a Jew during Pesach. The following is a partial list of local stores and their status regarding the purchase of Chometz.

- All stores under VAAD supervision are acceptable for the purchase of Chometz. (Note: Baked items from Dunkin' Donuts may not be eaten until 9:50 PM on Tuesday, April 27, because they are baked on Yom Tov. In general, Motza'ei Shabbos throughout the year, one should wait one hour after the end of Shabbos before eating their products.) The Vaad encourages the community to patronize local kosher establishments whenever possible.
- 2. ACME is the preferred store for the purchase of Chometz, since the store and its distributor are completely owned by non-Jews.
- 3. SHOP RITE on Route 1 South, Route 18 in East Brunswick, Bound Brook, Oak Tree Road and any other SHOP RITE with a Kosher Experience are all owned by non-Jews. (Note: other stores under the Shop Rite name may be owned by Jews.) However, the distributor which supplies these stores (Wakefern) has partial Jewish ownership. Since the majority ownership in Wakefern is non-Jewish, SHOP RITE is also acceptable.
- 4. The majority ownership of RITE AID Pharmacy is non-Jewish and acceptable for the purchase of Chometz.
- PATHMARK, A&P and STOP & SHOP are owned by non-Jews. However, their distributor, C & S (Cohen & Siegel), is Jewish. <u>Therefore, one should wait until Lag Bo'omer, Friday, May 23, to purchase overt Chometz from them</u>. (Overt Chometz includes cereal, cookies, crackers, pretzels, grains, and flour. Products which contain vinegar such as mayonnaise, ketchup, and mustard may be purchased since it is possible the vinegar is not chometz.)
- 6. C&S does not supply fresh bread. Therefore, fresh bread under Hashgocha may be bought at any non-Jewish owned store, including PATHMARK, A&P and STOP & SHOP, immediately after Pesach.
- 7. Non-chometz items may be purchased from any store (e.g., vegetables, cooking oil, etc.)
