Sof davar...

by Rabbi Israel Poleyeff, research by Danny Schlian Great historic personalities: Donna Gracia Mendes

Any talk of great personalities in the Middle Ages must include Donna Gracia Nasi Mendes. She was born into a Portuguese marrano family that was hiding their Jewish identity and thus she was named Beatrice de Luna. She married another marrano, a Francisco Mendes, a rather wealthy businessman. After his death in 1537 she took over the management of his business in Antwerp. In 1554 she made her way to Venice where she quickly discarded her Christian façade and became known as Donna Gracia Nassi Mendes. However, her sister (yes, sister!) denounced her to the authorities, charging that she was not a true Christian. As a result her property was taken from her and she was imprisoned briefly. Upon release she settled in the city of Ferrara where she went about assisting Portuguese marranos fleeing the Inquisition. In 1553 she was in Constantinople where she continued to lead various chessed enterprises. These included the establishment of synagogues, yeshivot and other educational academies both in Constantinople and in Salonika. Her fame grew rapidly, especially in the sefardic Jewish world. In 1556 she organized a boycott of the city of Ancona because they had burned 26 marranos at the stake. Her best achievement was yet to come. In 1558 she acquired a grant from the sultan of Turkey (bichvodo uve-atsmo) for the purpose of rebuilding the city of Tiberias and for the establishment of a yeshiva there. In recognition of these accomplishments a hotel was established in Tiberias bearing her name, Hotel Donna Gracia, which still exists today. A synagogue in Constantinople also bears her name. When she died in Israel in 1569 she left a legacy of service to the Jewish community unmatched by others of that era.
