# Tannaim and Amoraim: Rav Huna

This famous second generation *amora* was surrounded by some very distinguished people. He was the student of no less than Rav and Shmuel, and the teacher of the equally great Rabbah and Rav Yosef. In his youth Rav Huna was relatively poor and could not afford any money for wine, even for *kiddush*. Also he used a simple piece of rope for a belt. When Rav heard of this he blessed him saying that he will some day be covered in expensive silks. And that in fact is what happened. Rav also blessed others declaring that they be like Rav Huna. As he became famous he was surrounded by 300 *amoraim* when he *darshened*, a number that increased to 800 during the *yarchei kallah*. With the passing of Rav and Shmuel, Rav Huna became the head of the yeshiva in Sura, a position he held for 40 years. It was under his guidance that the yeshiva witnessed great growth. Rav Huna, like so many others, was concerned about the welfare of the poor. After a severe rain storm he would tour the living areas and when he saw that a building was in such bad shape that it might collapse on its inhabitants he ordered it torn down. If it was owned by a very poor person he would order the home rebuilt with public funds. On *erev Shabbat* he would buy up whatever vegetables were not sold so that the vendor would go home with a profit and would be encouraged to return the following week. He lived a long life. He was over 80 when he passed away. He asked that a *sefer torah* be placed in his *aron*, but this request was denied by the rabbis. Though he spent his entire career in Bavel he was laid to rest in Eretz Yisroel.
