Sof davar...

Tannaimm and Amoraim: R. Yehudah haNassi

No collection of sofei davar would be complete without one devoted to probably the greatest of them all, R. Yehudah haNassi. His father was the nasi R. Shimon ben Gamliel and he was the seventh generation after Hillel. It is said that on the day that R. Akiva died R. Yehudah was born, reflecting the idea that no generation is left bereft of a great leader. In later life Rebbi, as he was widely and affectionately known, became a very close friend of the emperor Antoninus. The story is told, however, that at the time of his birth there was a Roman decree in force that prohibited brit milah. The Caeser at the time heard that a son was born to the nasi and that he had a brit. He ordered the mother and child to be brought before him to determine the truth of the matter. The mother of Antoninus who also was born at that time had rachmonus on the child and substituted her own child for the examination. Yehudah was found to be an orel and he and his mother were released. He was a prodigious scholar and became the nasi and the head of the Sanhedrin. So well respected was he that he became known either simply as 'Rebbi' or 'Rabbeinu haKadosh'. He was very rich and during periods of famine he would open his storehouses for the poor. His friendship with Antoninus was legendary and the two would often have conversations on various subjects. Once Antoninus asked whether one is permitted to daven all day. Rebbi responded in the negative. Why not Antoninus wanted to know. The prayers would become insincere and bothersome, Rebbi responded. Antoninus would not accept his response. The following day Rebbi arrived at his palace and greeted him. An hour later he greeted him again. Antoninus was puzzled. Are you making fun of me? Rebbi continued, if you are bothered by constant greetings and praise, should not the king of kings be similarly bothered? Did Antoninus convert to Judaism as a result of his friendship with Rebbi? Some say he did. R. Yehudah haNasi is best remembered and revered for his monumental work, the compilation of the Mishna. Probably no other work has captured the imagination of Jews throughout the centuries as the Mishna. Written in Hebrew and encompassing only halachic decisions (except for masechet avot) the Mishna has been accepted universally in all yeshivot and batei medrash. It is the core work, after the chumash, for the understanding of halacha to this very day. When he passed away the sages decreed a universal fast day, and it was said that with his passing batla anavah, humility came to an end. A giant among scholars - R. Yehudah haNasi.
