Sof Davar by Moshe Sherman Shalom Elchanan Jaffe (1858-1923)

Last time I mentioned that in 1900, Rabbi Jacob Joseph had a second, debilitating stroke, which left him incapacitated, until his death in 1902. Since the Beth Hamedrash Hagodol urgently required rabbinic leadership, they turned to Rabbi Shalom Elchanan Jaffe to serve as their new rabbi. Born in a small town near Vilna in 1858, Jaffe was sent, at the age of 14, to the famous Volozhin yeshiva, where Rabbi Naphtali Zvi Yehuda Berlin (NETZIV) presided as rosh yeshiva. Following semicha from Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Spektor and the NETZIV, Jaffe served in several European towns as communal rav before accepting an invitation, in 1887, to become rabbi of Congregation Sheerith Sfard, in St. Louis, Missouri. While in St. Louis, he designated himself as Chief Rabbi, using the title 'av beit din' which stirred a good measure of disagreement. Two years later, in 1889, he returned to his hometown, Vabalninkas to serve as their communal rabbi. But in 1891, he returned for a second time to St. Louis, to serve as rabbi of another shul, Beth Hamedrosh Hagadol. (not to be confused with the N.Y shul of the same name). About two years later, another rav, Zacharia Yoseph Rosenfeld came to St. Louis to head Congregation Sheerith Sfard. A period of mutual antagonism and controversy ensued best illustrated by two disputes. During this period, Rabbi Jaffe spearheaded the construction of a *mikveh*, of which the kashruth was challenged by Rabbi Rosenfeld. Meanwhile Rabbi Rosenfeld approved and supervised an *eruv* in St. Louis, of which the kashruth was criticized by Rabbi Jaffe. Several treatises were published by both rabbis detailing their position on these matters. There were additional halachic disagreements, including the proper spelling of the name "St. Louis" in religious documents, such as a *ketuba* or *get*.

In 1897, Shalom Elchanan Jaffe left St. Louis for a shul in Brooklyn. Five years later he became rabbi of Beth Hamedrash Hagodol on the Lower East Side. That same year, 1902, Jaffe joined numerous other rabbis in founding the Agudath ha-Rabbonim. He later served as president of the Agudath ha-Rabbonim, the leading federation of Orthodox rabbis, at that time. He was also an active supporter of the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary in New York, and instrumental in obtaining the political support of the Agudath ha-Rabbonim for the RIETS veshiva.

As rabbi of the prestigious Beth Hamedrash Hagodol Jaffe emerged as an influential figure in the kosher supervision of New York slaughterhouses and butcher stores, a position which allowed him to determine the qualifications of rabbinic supervisors and shochtim and which also entailed substantial financial benefit. This powerful position at times made Jaffe a target for criticism by those, such as Rabbi Gabriel Zev (Velvel) Margolis, who harshly disapproved of the standards of the New York kashruth industry. While Rabbis Jaffe and Margolis remained lifelong foes, Jaffe retained the confidence and support of the great majority of his colleagues.

Jaffe published several books and articles, including *Pri Eshel*, a commentary on Yevamot, and *Shoel k'Inyan*, teshuvot on matters of contemporary halacha. His personal papers include several unpublished manuscripts and correspondence with leading European rabbis. Jaffe was 65 years old, when he died at Beth Israel Hospital, New York on November 15, 1923, leaving a wife and six children.
