#### R. Jacob Joseph and the Beth Hamedrash Hagodol

At 60 Norfolk near Grand Street, on Manhattan's Lower East Side, stands a dilapidated synagogue, in a bad state of disrepair - the Beth Hamedrash Hagadol. Once a striking building purchased in 1885 from the Norfolk Street Baptist Church, the structure has two towers with Gothic arched windows, carved pews, a vaulted ceiling, and an ornate gallery for women. The building was designated as a New York City landmark, yet it now lies ragged and abandoned. The story of the Beth Hamedrash Hagodol forms part of the lively history of New York Jewish life.

In the last issue of Sof Davar, I told you that Rabbi Abraham Joseph Ash helped establish the Beth Hamidrash on the Lower East side, in 1852, and seven years later, led a breakaway group of followers in founding a rival shul, which they called Beth Hamedrash Hagodol. Ash served, on and off, as a part time rabbi, at other times, as full time rabbi, for almost three decades. He was frequently consulted on matters of practical halakha, and periodically corresponded with European rabbonim.

When Rabbi Ash died in 1887, the Beth Hamedresh Hagodol began a search for a successor. Together with several nearby shuls, they formed the Association of American Orthodox Hebrew Congregations, to bring a distinguished *talmud chacham* from Europe, to serve not only as rabbi of Beth Hamedrash Hagodol but as <u>Chief Rabbi</u> of New York City. The search for a Chief Rabbi was opposed by many, including <u>Henry Pereira Mendes</u>, rabbi of <u>Shearith Israel</u>, the uptown Spanish and Portuguese synagogue. Mendes and his supporters felt that the money and effort would be better spent establishing a rabbinical seminary to train Americanborn rabbis. He argued that young, native English-speaking rabbis would appeal to the next generation of immigrant children far more than imported, Yiddish-speaking European rabbis. But the Eastern European immigrants who supported the consortium of Lower East Side shuls rejected this approach. Several eminent East European rabbonim were offered the position but turned it down. The field was narrowed to two candidates: Rav Zvi H. Rabinovitch, son of R. Yitzchak Elchanan Spektor and <u>R. Jacob Joseph</u>, who a few years earlier, in 1883, became the official *maggid* in Vilna. Although Rav Zvi H. Rabinovitch received considerable support from many leading East European rabbis, R. Jacob Joseph was hired by the Beth Hamedrash Hagodol, the Eldridge Street Synagogue, and 13 other Lower East Side shuls to become the first, and what would turn out to be, the only Chief Rabbi of New York. R. Jacob Joseph had studied at the Volozhin yeshiva under R. <u>Naftali Zvi Yehuda Berlin</u>, and was regarded as a disciple of R. <u>Yisroel Salanter</u>. Though Joseph's appointment was, in part, intended to bring prestige to the downtown Orthodox congregations, and develop a European style <u>kehilla</u> to New York, his primary task as Chief Rabbi was to bring order and regulation to New York's chaotic kosher slaughtering industry.

Joseph arrived in New York on July 7, 1888, and later that month delivered his inaugural Shabbos derasha at the Beth Hamedrash Hagodol. Newspaper reports indicate that R. Joseph's appearance attracted a huge crowd of over 1,500 men inside the shul, with thousands more standing outside. Police were called as extra reinforcements to control the crowd, and to help escort Rabbi Joseph to shul. Notwithstanding the initial excitement, R. Jacob Joseph had a difficult challenge. His Yiddish derashos had little impact on the younger generation. He had no administrative experience or training, other local Orthodox rabbis outside his congregation did not accept his authority, and non-Orthodox Jews and groups criticized him. Sadly, he suffered a <u>stroke</u> in 1895, and a relapse in 1900, which left him bedridden. Nonetheless when he died in July 1902, tens of thousands of people lined the streets of the Lower East Side to offer respect to the illustrious Rav.
