Binyomin Wilhelm (1886–1972)

One of the important baalei batim, whose effort and commitment had a profound influence on the founding and growth of Mesivta Torah Vodaath, in Brooklyn, was Binyomin Wilhelm. Born in Lodz, in 1886, Wilhelm came from a family of Radoshitz chasidim. The Radoshitz <u>dynasty</u> had been founded by R. <u>Yisochor Ber Baron</u> (1765–1843), a disciple of the Chozeh (Seer) of Lublin. A deeply pious man, the Rebbe of Radoshitz was also known as the *Saba Kadisha*.

Binyamin Wilhelm was around eight years old when his mother died. He went to live with a cousin and then later with an elderly grandfather who died when Binyomin was about 17 years old. With no one to care for him, he accepted the advice of friends to leave for America. With little money to pay for transit, he took a job as a mashgiach on a boat headed to the United States. He arrived at Ellis Island in 1907. Like so many immigrants, Wilhelm began peddling with a pushcart on the streets of the Lower East Side. He earned enough money to rent a store selling houseware supplies, and in 1917, he moved to the Williamsburg section of Brooklyn, which was then regarded as an upscale neighborhood.

There were few yeshivos at that time in the United States. The Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Yeshiva, Rabbi Jacob Joseph Yeshiva and the Rabbi Shlomo Kluger Yeshiva were all located in the Lower East Side of Manhattan. Despite the growing number of Jews moving to Brooklyn, there were no yeshivas in the larger New York City area other than those of the Lower East Side. To make matters more difficult, there were many families, even those who remained observant, who were content to have their children receive a public school education. In a diary entry, Binyomin Wilhelm recorded the following thought: "Even in many homes that were officially shomer shabbos, after the chulent and kugel, the mothers gave their children some coins to buy tickets to the movies, saying, "They're still young, the children. Let them enjoy themselves a bit." Wilhelm was determined to establish a Brooklyn yeshiva, where the boys would study Torah in the morning and secular studies in the afternoon. With enormous energy and perseverance, he led a dedicated group of like-minded families to establish Mesivta Torah Vodaath in 1917. Two decades later in 1937, he was instrumental in establishing the first Bais Yaakov school for girls in Williamsburg.

Binyamin Wilhelm remained active at the Torah Vodaath Yeshiva through his 80's, when he moved to <u>Israel</u> in 1968. He died four years later in 1972. The Ribbono shel Olam rewarded Binyamin Wilhelm with an exceptional grandson. His daughter's son was Rabbi Yisroel Belsky zt"l, who became a rosh yeshiva at Torah Vodaath, a halachic authority for OU kosher certification, and an important posek in America.
