Twitter: Eruv's official alerts are sent out via Twitter.Follow @hp_eruv on Twitter Get updates about eruv's status as it's been determined.

•Text Messages: Don't have a Smartphone or don't want to use Twitter? Get alerts via text. This involves setting up a Twitter account, but once setup, you can ignore your Twitter account. It gives you immediate alerts without Twitter blather. •Facebook: Facebook group @hperuv that gets updated when we update Twitter account. Follow Facebook group (don't just "Like" it), and you'll get alerts about the eruv's status via Facebook. •Email: Go to http://hperuv.org and sign up for the email list. The email list checks the eruv's status after 3pm once per hour and sends out an email with updates.

 Eruv Webpage: The eruv webpage at <u>http://hperuv.org</u> has the latest Twitter feed displayed on the bottom of the front page.
 Hotline: Yes, there is still the eruv hotline.

R. Zev Wolf Gold (1889-1956)

The <u>religious Zionist</u> organization, Mizrachi (acronym for *Merkaz Ruchani*) was founded in 1902, in <u>Vilna</u>, under the leadership of <u>Rabbi Yitzchak Yaacov Reines</u>. It took more than a decade for an American branch of Mizrachi to gain cohesion and strength. Rabbi Meir Berlin, son of R. Naphtali Zvi Yehudah Berlin, (Netziv) and General Secretary of World Mizrachi came to the United States in November 1913, to raise funds and organize several local groups that supported the ideals of religious Zionism. The official founding conference of American Mizrachi, under R. Meir Berlin's leadership, was held in Cincinnati, in 1914. Several American rabbis were helpful and supportive of this effort but one noteworthy individual, who closely assisted R. Meir Berlin, and who eventually became a world leader in religious Zionism was Rabbi Zev (Wolf) Gold.

Born in Sczcyzyin, Poland, in 1889, he studied at the Mir yeshiva with R. Eliyahu Baruch Kamei, and Yeshiva Torah Vo'Da'as at Lida, headed by R. Yitzchak Yaacov Reines. In 1906, at the age of 17, R. Gold received semicha from the notable *posek*, Rabbi Eliezer Rabinowitz, Av Beit Din of Minsk (1859-1924). A year later, he married Yocheved, daughter of R. Moshe Reichler, communal rabbi of Juteka. For a short while, he succeeded his father-in-law as communal rav, until departing for America in 1907.

For the next 28 years, R. Gold served as a rabbi in several American cities, including Chicago, Scranton, (until 1912), Williamsburg, (until 1919), San Francisco (until 1924), and again in Brooklyn, until 1935. A tall, handsome man with excellent skills as an orator and administrator, R. Gold's formidable presence was felt in all communities that he served. While in Williamsburg, for example, he established the Williamsburg Talmud Torah, and in 1917 was one of several founders of Mesivta Torah Vodaath.

R. Gold's foremost concern to which he dedicated much of his professional career was the advancement of religious Zionism. He arranged for his rabbinic contract to stipulate that he is to be given three months a year to travel and work on behalf of the religious Zionist movement. A delegate to numerous World Zionist congresses, Gold traveled throughout Europe and the United States on behalf of Keren Kayemet, (JNF) raising funds for the purchase and development of land, in what was then, British Mandate Palestine. In 1913, when R. Meir Berlin, secretary of World Mizrachi, came to New York to organize a branch of Mizrachi in the United States, a lifelong relationship was established between R. Gold, R. Berlin and the Mizrachi movement. For the next 40 years, R. Gold traveled throughout the United States and Canada organizing chapters of Mizrachi and winning adherents to the cause of religious Zionism. When R. Gold became president of American Mizrachi in 1932, he began establishing branches of Mizrachi in South America, as well.

In 1935, R. Gold realized his personal Zionist dream by emigrating from the United States to Palestine. During the late 1930s, he assisted in the development of an agricultural community, now religious moshav, Kfar ha-Roeh, named for R. Avraham ha-Cohen Kook (acronym of *resh, aleph, heh*). And in 1939, he was among those who assisted in the establishment of the first yeshiva of the Bnai Akiva movement, Yeshivat Kfar ha-Roeh. Today, the yeshiva at Kfar ha-Roeh boasts many distinguished alumni.

During the 1940s, Rabbi Gold worked for the Jewish Agency in various administrative capacities, and following the creation of the State, he became head of the Department of Torah Education and Culture, supplying numerous day schools in the United States and Canada, with Israeli teachers and educational material designed to improve their religious curriculum.

No doubt, one of the most notable events of his life occurred on May 14, 1948, when Rabbi Zev Gold was included among the distinguished and exclusive group of 37 individuals, who signed Israel's Declaration of Independence.

Rabbi Zev (Wolf) Gold died in Jerusalem in April 1856, and buried at the Sanhedria Cemetery, near the grave of his lifelong friend, Rabbi Meir Berlin. Following his death, a women's seminary was named in his memory. No doubt, some of you remember, Machon Gold.
