LOCAL ERUV: We have six official ways of alerting you to eruv's status. Be aware and find out eruv status every week before Shabbat and Chaggim. 'Twitter: Eruv's official alerts are sent out via Twitter.Follow @hp_eruv on Twitter Get updates about eruv's status as it's been determined. 'Text Messages: Don't have a Smartphone or don't want to use Twitter? Get alerts via text. This involves setting up a Twitter account, but once setup, you can ignore your Twitter account. It gives you immediate alerts without Twitter blather. **Facebook**: Facebook group @hperuv that gets updated when we update Twitter account. Follow Facebook group (don't just "Like" it), and you'll get alerts about the eruv's status via Facebook. **Email**: Go to <u>http://hperuv.org</u> and sign up for the email list. The email list checks the eruv's status after 3pm once per hour and sends out an email with updates.

• **Eruv Webpage**: The eruv webpage at <u>http://hperuv.org</u> has the latest Twitter feed displayed on the bottom of the front page.
