RABBI'S CORNER

When and where should one take and Lulav and Esrog and recite the Beracha? The Arizal (quoted in the Mishna Berura 651:34) would fulfill his Mitzvah of Lulav in the Sukkah before going to shul. The Mishna Berura suggests that the reason for this is either because we do not want to delay the Mitzvah or based on Kabbalah. Others suggest that we specifically wait to take the Lulav and Esrog until right before Hallel in Shul (implication of the Shulchan Aruch 644). One reason is that תדיר קודם (we usually do what is more common first) and davening is more common than Lulav (Rav Moshe Feinstein). An additional reason is that shaking the Lulav in Hallel is part of or the completion of the Mitzvah. Therefore, it's best not to have a large break between the start of the Mitzvah and the end of Mitzvah (Brisker Rav).
