<u>RABBI'S CORNER</u>

The Magen Avraham (669:1) quotes the Sefer Seder Hayom that there were places that omitted Tachanun from Sukkos until the start of Cheshvan. The Pri Chadash (131:6) rules like this as well. The Seder Hayom (end of Hilchos Sukkos) suggests that the month of Tishrei is such a happy month that it would be inappropriate to recite Tachanun. He explains that there are four major Yomim Tovim in the month (Rosh Hashana, Yom Kippur, Sukkos, and Shemini Atzeres), we achieve forgiveness for our sins, and the Beis Hamikdash was completed during the time of Shlomo Hamelech in this month. While most Sefardim follow this practice (Kaf HaChaim Orach Chaim 131:98 and 669:42) and Chazon Ovadia (Yamim Noraim page 394), the Shaarei Teshuva (131:19) concludes that the correct custom is to recite Tachanun after Sukkos (with the exception of Isru Chag). This is indeed the custom of our Shul.

COMMUNITY ANNOUNCEMENTS NJ DOT ROAD DIET PLAN

The article below discusses the "Road Diet" Plan that the NJ Department of Transportation is formulating and this might be the only opportunity for the community to have input into the final version of that plan. The plan will in effect reduce the size of Route 27 from Brookhill Road until North 8th Avenue from 4 lanes to 2 lanes. This will be done due to the above average number for accidents on a roadway that size. We are asking people to read the report and watch the explanatory video to understand why they are doing this. The DOT has studied this stretch of road over a period of a few years and they have determined that it is indeed a very dangerous stretch of road.

This stretch of road also includes Glatt 27, the Highland Park Kollel, The Agudah, Yeshiva Shaarei Tzion PreSchool and Reenas Bais Yaakov as well as other stores we frequent. It is also the road that Hatzolah Ambulances use to go to the hospitals in New Brunswick.

One of the glaring issues that we saw in this report is the completion date of 2029 which is way too long for this to occur. We need this implemented as soon as possible.

There are other issues that we saw and we hope that as many people as possible from our community will take the 15 minutes to watch and read the report and respond to the DOT with their comments.

The reason that Highland Park is asking that this be distributed immediately is that we only have until October 16, 2023 (less than 2 weeks) to view the plan and respond to the DOT website with our comments.
