Rabbi's Corner

Kiddush Bimakom Seuda (part 1)

Over the next few weeks, we will review and summarize the many Halachos of Kiddush Bimakom Seudah (Kiddush in the place of the meal).

Halacha states that one needs to recite Kiddush and eat a "meal" in the same "place". If one recites Kiddush and does not immediately eat a "meal" then they have not fulfilled their Mitzvah of Kiddush (and according to most would be forbidden to eat since one is not allowed to eat prior to Kiddush).

What is the definition of "in the same place" (in future weeks we will discuss the definition of "meal"? Certainly, one is not allowed to recite Kiddush in one house or building and eat in another building. This would mean that one can't hear Kiddush in our shul and then eat at RPRY without saying or hearing Kiddush again at RPRY. Even if one would have in mind while hearing Kiddush that their plan is to eat in another building it would not be allowed (Shulchan Aruch 273). It is important to note that once you fulfilled Kiddush in one house or building (which means your heard kiddush and ate in that building), you can eat at another house or building without needing to recite or hear another kiddush.

Next week, we will learn whether it is ok to recite kiddush in one room and eat in another

Rabbi Yehudah Heschel Levenberg and the New Haven Yeshiva

At the 1923 convention of the Agudath ha-Rabbanim, the association of Eastern European trained rabbis in North America, R. Yehuda Heschel Levenberg proposed opening a post high school yeshivah in New Haven, Connecticut, where he served as communal rabbi. He received resounding support, and later that year, R. Levenberg established the New Haven College of Talmud - Beis Medrash l'Rabbanim, one of the first yeshivas located outside of New York City.

Born in Latvia in 1884, Yehuda H. Levenberg had been sent to the Slobodka yeshiva following his bar mitzvah, where he was influenced by the musar approach of the Alter of Slabodka, R. Nosson Zvi Finkel. In 1910, R. Moshe Mordechai Epstein, head of the Slobodka yeshiva, dispatched R. Levenberg to the United States, to raise funds for the yeshiva. R. Levenberg chose to remain in America, first becoming a pulpit rabbi in Jersey City, N.J, and then, in 1917, accepting a position in New Haven.

When the yeshiva opened in August, 1923, R. Levenberg's communal responsibilities precluded him from administering the yeshiva on his own. He hired R. Yaakov Dov Safsal (1888-1968) and R. Moshe Sheinkopf as *roshei yeshiva*, but they did not remain for long. In 1924, Rabbi Shabtai Sheftel Kramer (1875-1942), brother in law of R. Moshe Mordechai Epstein, arrived in America to become *rosh yeshiva*. With the hiring of R. Sheftel Kramer, a fellow Slobodka trained Talmud scholar, R. Levenberg was confident that the New Haven yeshiva would reflect the excellence and spirit of Slobodka musar.

When R. Levenberg departed New Haven in 1929 for a rabbinic position in Cleveland, Rabbi Sheftel Kramer agreed to relocate, and the New Haven yeshiva moved to Cleveland. Indeed, though situated in Cleveland, the yeshiva was still popularly referred to, in Hebrew, as *Yeshivas Nyu Haven*. In 1930, the yeshiva leadership was enhanced with the arrival of R. Sheftel Kramer's son-in-law, Rabbi Yaakov Yitzchak Ruderman. When R. Levenberg became ill, he closed the yeshiva in 1937, and died shortly thereafter, in January, 1938.
