Rabbi's Corner

Kiddush Bimakom Seuda (part 2)

Last week, we learned that in order for your Kiddush to be considered Bimakom Seuda the meal needs to be eaten in the same building where the Kiddush was recited. Even making Kiddush in one building with explicit intent to eat in another building would not work. What about different rooms in the same building? Shulchan Aruch (273), based on the Gemara (Pesachim 101a), rules that for Kiddush to be considered Bimakom Seudah the kiddush and "meal" need to be done in the same room. Kiddush in one room and eating in another room does not work. However, the Shulchan Aruch does write that it would be valid if one had in mind while reciting kiddush in one room that they will eat in another room. This is what we rely on in our Shul every Shabbos where we recite kiddush upstairs and eat downstairs. While the Mishna Berura (Biur Halacha 273) notes that ideally one should not rely on this, many other Poskim including The Aruch Hashulchan and Rav Shmuel Kaminetzky Shlit"a rule that this works even optimally.
