Rabbi's Corner

Kiddush Bimakom Seuda (part 3)

In the previous two installments of the Rabbi's Corner, we defined "Makom" in the need for Kiddush to be in the same "Makom" as the Seuda. This week we will define "seuda". While a Seuda is normally defined by a meal consisting of bread, the Rishonim and Acharonim allow for a looser definition of "seuda" as it relates to Kiddush Bimakom Seuda. The Shulchan Aruch (273:5) writes that it would suffice to drink the amount of wine that would require a Beracha Acharona. The Mishna Berura (22) points out that this is a Reviis. The Mishna Berura (27) quotes those who maintain that one Reviis is not sufficient and two would be needed. The Shaar Hatziyum (29) concludes that for the day Kiddush, one Reviis would suffice. There is a dispute regarding the size of a Reviis. Practically speaking, for Rabbinic matters (such as Shabbos day Kiddush), the measurement of three ounces can be relied on. This would mean that one can fulfill Kiddush Bimakom Seuda by drinking three ounces of wine or grape juice. The Mishna Berura (25) adds that Rebbe Akiva Eiger points out that many Rishonim do not allow the drinking of wine to count as a Seudah and paskens that it should not be relied unless there are extenuating circumstances.
